This resource is divided into five sections that focus on different aspects of missionary service. Take your time and give each section the proper time to reflect and respond to the different materials. Mission Topics:

• Week 1: Call to Mission - We will look at our relationship with God and consider the privilege of responding to a call to serve in mission - serving as we follow the example given by Christ.



• Week 2: Cost of Mission - We will examine how understanding the cost of leaving home and comforts presents challenging situations and develops our resiliency to serve in a different capacity.



• Week 3: Contribution to Mission – We will evaluate our skills and gifts while exploring how these skills can contribute to mission opportunities.




• Week 4: Culture of Mission – We will assess our openness to other cultures and beliefs and gauge our potential to embrace a new community.



• Week 5: Connection to Mission - We will reflect on how our current leadership and life experiences can equip us for the journey of transitioning into mission.



Each mission component will offer you a different way to engage with the material and is tailored to accommodate different learning styles both in children and adults. You do not need to complete every component every week, only what is most helpful for you and your family. Each topic will allow you to engage in the following ways:





Reflect - Questions that build on the teaching and other activities will allow for deeper, personal reflection while providing ways to include influential supporters in the discernment process with you.

Connect - Missionaries will share personal experiences from their time of service when they learned how to connect the theoretical with the reality of their context.

Explore - Additional resources will be given for further reading; these resources will give you a broader exposure to the topic and practical ways to continue discerning your call.
